In view of this, it is deemed fit to account for the payment of gratuity as and when the liability arises. The company is having adequate liquidity to pay the gratuity liability at the time of its occurrence.

#### 1 Report on the Financial Statements

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of M/s. SARADHAMBIKA PAPER AND BOARD MILLS PRIVATE LIMITED("the Company"), as of 31st March, 2023, which comprise the Balance Sheet as at March 31, 2023, and the Statement of Profit and Loss and Statement of Cash Flow for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

#### 2 Opinion

#### SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### 1 Company Information

M/s. SARADHAMBIKA PAPER AND BOARD MILLS PRIVATE LIMITED is a private Limited Company with registered office at D.No.7/5, Sellakumarapalayam, Polavakalipalayam Post, GOBICHETTIPALAYAM - 638 476. The Company is in the business of manufacture and sale of Kraft Paper and Boards and primarily caters to the Indian Market.

#### 2 Basis of Preparation and Measurement

#### 2.1 Basis of Preparation

The financial statements have been prepared and presented under the historic cost convention on accrual basis of accounting, in accordance with Generally Accepted Accounting Principles ("GAAP") applicable in India. GAAP comprises mandatory accounting standards as prescribed under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 ('Act') and pronouncements of the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India, the provisions of the Act (to the extent notified).

#### 2.2 Key Accounting Estimates and Judgements

The preparation of standalone financial statements requires management to make judgments, estimates and assumptions in the application of accounting policies that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, income and expenses. Actual results may differ from these estimates. Continuous evaluation is done on the estimation and judgments based on historical experience and other factors, including expectations of future events that are believed to be reasonable. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised prospectively

#### 2.3 Significant Accounting Policies

The significant accounting policies used in preparation of the standalone financial statements are as under.

#### a) Property, Plant & Equipment

Property, plant and equipment is stated at acquisition cost net of accumulated depreciation and accumulated impairment losses, if any. Cost of acquisition or construction of property, plant and equipment comprises its purchase price including import duties and non-refundable purchase taxes after deducting trade discounts, rebates and any directly attributable cost of bringing the item to its working condition for its intended use.

Subsequent costs are included in the asset's carrying amount or recognised as a separate asset, as appropriate, only when it is probable that future economic benefits associated with the item will flow to the Company and the cost of the item can be measured reliably. All other repairs and maintenance cost are charged to the standalone statement of profit and loss during the period in which they are incurred.

Gains or losses that arise on disposal or retirement of an asset are measured as the difference between net disposal proceeds and the carrying value of property, plant and equipment and are recognized in the statement of profit and loss when the same is derecognized.

Depreciation is charged on Written-down Value Method on all the assets as per Part C of Schedule II of the Companies Act, 2013. Freehold land is not depreciated.

c) Revenue Recognition		

Revenue is recognized to the extent that it is probable that, the economic benefits will flow to the Company and the revenue can be reliably estimated and collectability is reasonably assured. Revenue from sale of goods is recognised when control of the products being sold is transferred to our customer and when there are no longer any unfulfilled obligations. The Performance Obligations in our contracts are fulfilled at the time of dispatch, delivery or upon formal customer acceptance depending on customer terms.

Non monetary items which are carried in terms of historical cost denominated in a foreign currency are reported using the exchange rate at the date of the transaction. Exchange differences arising on foreign exchange transactions settled during the year and on restatement as at the balance sheet date are recognized in the statement of profit and loss for the year.

Current tax is measured at the amount expected to be paid to the taxation authorities, using the applicable tax rates and tax laws. Deferred tax is recognised in respect of timing differences between taxable income and accounting income i.e. differences that originate in one period and are capable of reversal in one or more subsequent periods. Contingent liabilities do not warrant provisions, but are disclosed unless the possibility of outflow of resources is remote. Contingent assets are neither recognised nor disclosed in the financial statements. However, contingent assets are assessed continually and if it is virtually certain that an inflow of economic benefits will arise, the asset and related income are recognised in the period in which the change occurs
